Association Meeting March 20 2019

Introductions: Shah Smith opened the meeting and introduced the Board members, Keith McCracken and Rob Adelson of AMC Management. Norm Rhea and Steve Borgmann, Maryland Heights Councilmen, and Jim Carver, Economic Development Manager for Maryland Heights, were also introduced.

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Management Report by Keith McCracken:

Autumn Lakes Association as of 2/28/19 was \$134 over budget on income YTD and \$1763 under budget on expenses YTD. Autumn Lakes Condominiums as of 2/28/19 was \$1,828 under budget in income YTD and \$408 over budget on expenses YTD.

Rob and Dave have been very busy addressing work requests, cleaning gutters, applying pre-emergent fertilizer to our lawns and preparing for spring. Squirrels, birds and raccoons continue to be a problem in our attics, please do not feed the wildlife as it creates a nuisance situation.

The spring leaf clean-up is underway and should be completed by March 27. Mulch was done in 2018 and will not be done in 2019. We are on a two year cycle for mulch.

We have had severe winds come through the area over the past couple of weeks blowing tree limbs down throughout the property and causing roof damage on several buildings. Rob and Dave have been cleaning up the limbs and *Pridemaster* made necessary roof repairs.

We are currently reviewing the painting schedule for 2019; 12 buildings are being considered.

We are due for asphalt sealing of driveways and parking lots this year. Notice letters will go out with the dates and schedule. Units that were identified as needing driveway repairs and replacements will be notified. The Board and Keith identified these driveways on our fall walk-through.

The Basketball and Tennis Court have been resurfaced, restriped and we have purchased portable pickleball nets for the tennis court which are stored in the new storage container in the court enclosure. The tennis court now has a dual purpose court. It can be set up for two pickleball courts or one tennis court. New signs are being installed indicating Residents Only, No Trespassing, and Courts Close at Sunset. Access to the tennis court is by key only. To use the courts, please contact the AMC office to get a personal key. There is a \$5 deposit for the key.

Residents are required to obtain Board approval for decks, windows, door replacements or modifications, as well as any other exterior architectural changes. All necessary city permits are required.

Residents are encouraged to know where the water shut-offs are in their unit and that they function properly. In the event of a water emergency, knowing where and how to shut off the water flow quickly is very important and can save thousands of dollars in damage to your unit and the neighboring units. Every unit should have functional water shut-

offs for the entire unit and for the toilets, sinks, water heaters, etc. If you don't know where your shut-off is, the right time to find out is now—before you need it! Dick Ornberg is also willing to help residents locate the water shut-offs. If anyone needs water shut-off identification tags, contact Shah Smith.

Board Reports:

Political Signs – As we come closer to election season, the Association would like to remind everyone that political signs are not allowed on common ground. Condo owners, because the land surrounding the buildings is considered common ground, cannot place signs outside their condos. Placing signs in windows or storms doors, or on vehicles is acceptable. Due to a change in Missouri Law, house owners can place political signs on their own property. No vender signs are allowed in Autumn Lakes (see sign policy).

Roofing Questions – Please remember, for the condos, the Association takes care of the roofing needs of the buildings. You may see vendors come into the neighborhood after strong storms offering free roofing assessments. Please refer them to the AMC office.

Pool Card – Pool access cards will be available at the May Association Meeting or anytime at the AMC office. Pool access cards are available to residents, 2 per unit, for a \$10 deposit each. Residents who are current with their Association fees may use the pool. Those residents who have pool access cards from last year and are current with their fees, will be able to use those same cards for 2019.

Board Elections: Shah Smith explained that there will be two Association Board positions up for election during the May meeting. Those positions are currently held by Jay Black and Jennifer Morgan. You must be a unit or home owner in good standing to run for a trustee position. **If you are interested in running in the upcoming election for trustees, please contact the AMC office for the Candidate Information application by Friday, April 5th. The application form is due no later than April 12th. Ballots will be mailed about April 30th.**

Spring Garage Sale – The neighborhood-wide Spring Garage Sale will be held on Saturday May 18th. The Association will put out signs and advertisements for this sale.

Seismic Update/Quarry Blasting – Early this year, residents reported feeling higher seismic activity as part of the quarry blasting; Jay Black continues to do research on this each time this happens. He is currently working with Waste Connection (formerly Fred Weber), and the City to see what can be done. The Quarry owners installed a seismograph to study the magnitude of the current blasting. Once monitoring is concluded, and the results are in, Jay plans a meeting with Maryland Heights, the quarry and the AL Board to talk about the issue. Bridgeton is also affected and is working through their own channels.

Committee Reports:

Architectural Committee:

Dick explained that the entry sign on the north side of the entrance was partially blown down by winds. Rob and Dave have made a temporary repair. The Board is looking to replace the signs with next year's budget. A new logo has also been designed to reflect our pride in our neighborhood. It will be unveiled at the May meeting.

Landscaping Committee:

Emerald Ash Borer Tree Treatments: We are due to treat the trees again this year for the emerald ash borer. Treatment is done every other year. Jay will be working with the landscaping committee and Gamma Tree Service to survey the trees and identify which trees need to be treated. So far the trees that have been treated have been doing well.

Jim Carver spoke to the residents present at the meeting about upcoming development opportunities in Maryland Heights. Jim used to be one of our Ward 4 city councilmen. These new businesses will add to our tax revenue to support services. (Maryland Heights residents do not pay personal property tax.)

- The city is expecting to do several site visits with new businesses interested in Maryland Heights to increase entertainment and business opportunities.
- The city is also considering a new housing development .
- The city is continually looking for quality projects rather than quantity.

City Councilman Report: Norm Rhea provided information about some of the upcoming things in Maryland Heights highlighted in the Maryland Heights newsletter.

- City will be holding quarterly meetings about the City/County Merger.
